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
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PREPARING NEXT GENERATION LEADERS SINCE 2015

ASPIRING LEADERS ON THREE CONTINENTS

Our International Leadership Academies are truly special. They provide a transformative experience for teen girls, instilling in them a sense of confidence and leadership that extends far beyond our week together. Through hands-on learning on topics such as design thinking, financial literacy, and project management, our participants are equipped with practical skills that prepare them for the challenges of the future.

But it's not just about the skills they acquire. What sets our Academies apart is the daily interaction among girls from vastly different backgrounds. It's the casual conversations over meals, the reflective discussions on global issues, and the bonds that form as a result. It's about celebrating each girl's uniqueness while also recognizing the common threads that bind us all together.

After nine years, it's clear that our in-person Academies are more than just a series of activities. They're a place where girls can grow, learn, and form lasting friendships that transcend borders, cultures, and languages. It's a place where they can be themselves, discover the power of their own potential, AND recognize their role in a larger movement to create a more just and sustainable world.

With COVID restrictions lifted across all our locations, the 2023 cohorts at each of our hubs were able to enjoy **more in-person Power Mentor sessions** and go on **excursions to explore sustainability** topics relevant to their areas. These experiences ensured more immersive, hands-on learning, and hearing about the excursions at other hubs offered participants valuable insights into different contexts.

Another fantastic opportunity for girls in our three hubs to learn from each other is during our **online Power Mentor sessions**. Here, participants from **two hubs often co-moderate sessions**, allowing for a rich exchange of ideas. Additionally, participants gain insights into the interests and concerns of their global peers by listening to the questions they ask the speakers.

A cherished tradition at GGU continues to be the exchange of **location-introduction videos**. These videos, which give a virtual tour of each hub, always showcase creativity and humor, and provide participants in all locations with a deeper understanding of the physical surroundings at the other hubs.



OUR SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

Our 2023 Academy focused on all of the ways, big and small, that individuals, communities, companies, and governments can contribute to creating a sustainable future. In addition to exploring the UN Sustainable Development Goals and discussing issues affecting their communities, some of the highlights that allowed our girls to delve into sustainability included:

- In India, participants visited upcycling initiatives <u>reCharkha</u> <u>Upcycled</u> and <u>studio Alternative</u>s, where they learned about ways to reduce waste and reCharkha's efforts to conserve the environment while preserving tradition and enabling rural livelihoods, using waste plastic weave fabric using a traditional charkha (spindle).
- In Malawi, participants visited the <u>Nkhotakota Wildlife</u> <u>Reserve</u>. They learned about the reserve's history, the current species within the reserve, and the various ongoing antipoaching efforts. The girls also explored the land and learned about the community stories collected by the reserve.
- In Germany, an app prototyping workshop at <u>Good Lab</u> allowed GGU girls to test out the sustainability approaches they had ideated the day before. They also had a private tour and panel discussion at the <u>Technical University of</u> <u>Berlin Production Center, including a hands-on 3D printing</u> workshop and exploring the ways advanced technology contributes to sustainability.









At the end of the week, our aspiring changemakers presented **their commitments to promoting sustainbility.** From innovative ways to decrease food waste and limit the effects of fast fashion to ideas for uplifting girls and underserved people around the world, we loved watching their confident and passionate presentations.

We were incredibly honored that powerful women from a wide range of backgrounds and professions took the time to share their perspectives about sustainability with our cohorts in all locations.

GERMANY LEADERSHIP ACADEMY



Highlights

DIVERSITY IS OUR SUPERPOWER!

In 2023 we welcomed 37 aspiring changemakers representing 15 countries, including ambassadors from the Abury Foundation (Morocco), Becomtech (France), and Future Holders (Israel/ Palestine). Two things we love most about bringing together such diverse groups of teen girls: the global perspectives they gain on topics from climate change to music trends, and the incredibly vibrant and festive cultural exchange celebrations that truly honor everyone's heritage.

CULTIVATING NEXT GENERATION FACILITATORS

We're excited to be training a new generation of facilitators. These young leaders, including teachers, NGO founders, community organizers, and youth coaches, bring fresh perspectives to our proven program and serve as role models for our participants. We're proud that they can also help us expand our curriculum and message to new communities.

MALAWI LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

ALUMNAE INTERNS INSPIRE!

We love to support our girls as they grow from first-time participants to leaders. So when two of our GGU Malawi asked to return as interns, our answer was an enthusiastic yes! Not only was this a great opportunity for our alumnae to apply skills they learned as participants, they also motivated current participants and fostered an environment of trust and open communication. At the end of the week, the alumnae admitted that they did not expect that it took so much effort behind the scenes to run the program. About the experience, Tamandani (18) says:

SUSTAINABLE INSIGHTS

Our dynamic Malawi cohort left their home base at Kamuzu Academy to visit Nkhotakota Wildlife Reserve, which focuses on conservation and preservation of forests and animals. Participants gained in-depth understanding of the SDG 15, Life on Land, and how it relates to the wildlife in their country. This hands-on learning about wildlife in Malawi and current efforts to protect animals in and the environment inspired them to be part of the change.

INDIA LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

REACHING NEW COMMUNITIES

Thanks to outreach from our India facilitator team, our 2023 Academy in India brought together young women from rural and urban areas in and around Pune, allowing for participants from various backgrounds to connect with and learn from each other. We are currently working on getting the funding to translate our curriculum and all learning materials into Marathi so that our program is accessible to all interested girls, especially those who haven't had as much experience with English.

MAKING SUSTAINABILITY TANGIBLE

Our India Academy participants had two exciting hands-on learning opportunities visiting local upcycling initiatives. They learned about the innovative ways these companies are making use of waste while creating employment opportunities and developing useful products, from homemade soap to beautiful bags and decorations.

GGU ALUMNA JOINS OUR FACILITATOR TEAM

In 2023, GGU alumna Sachi Patil joined our facilitator team in India. This was a fantastic opportunity not only because Sachi is an exemplary ambassador of GGU, deeply connected with our mission and approach, but also because she originally hails from Pune and speaks Marathi. This allowed for great mutual learning between Sachi and our Indian facilitators and participants, coupled with new insights for everyone.



Being a facilitator in India in 2023 was truly amazing. GGU really is what the facilitators make of it and the girls reflect the energy that's brought to them. Seeing these girls open up and learn made all the hard-work the other facilitators and I put into it incredibly rewarding. My biggest takeaway was that while you learn as a participant,



While our Leadership Academies are the first critical step in launching next generation leaders, our year-round programming supports and encourages them as they apply what they've learned in daily life. Through online and in-person events, our changemakers stay connected, supported, and inspired.

FEMALE VOICES OF THE FUTURE



We kicked off 2023 with a hybrid event hosted by Deutsche Bahn in Berlin that connected GGU alumnae from around the world with inspirational women in our network. We were honored that Kristina Lunz, Co-Founder of the Centre for Feminist Foreign Policy joined us as a keynote speaker. It was a lively and enriching evening of exchange between generations. PANEL DISCUSSIONS



Among the online discussion sessions hosted in 2023 was a very insightful panel discussion on politics, policy making, and development. Our participants were thrilled to learn from these impressive women about how they have forged paths to make a tangible difference in the world.

INSPIRATIONAL EVENTS



We love to learn from women leaders! In addition to alumna attending a reading by Kristina Lunz at the Mexican Embassy in Berlin, two of our co-founders attended Frauen100, where they heard from women in a wide variety of fields about their efforts to create a more gender-equitable world.

FROM PARTICIPANT TO TEAM MEMBER : SKILLS IN ACTION

We love to watch our GGU alumnae grow into leadership positions not only within their respective communities but also within the framework of Girls Gearing Up!

In 2023, seven talented GGU alumna from five countries ranging in age from 14-23 joined our team as interns in a variety of roles. Their fresh perspectives, innovative ideas, and unwavering enthusiasm have added a dynamic layer to our daily operations. We are committed and absolutely thrilled for the younger generation contribute to our mission – not only because it provides hands-on leadership and growth opportunities, but also because it ensures we are centering their perspectives and needs in everything we do.

"I interned at Girls Gearing Up for two weeks. My initial motivation ...was to learn more about the work experience, how an NGO works, and because I firmly believe in the mission of GGU itself. I later found out there is so much more to it. I learned and gained so much from this experience, including new skills and knowledge. Through completing a variety of tasks, I improved my social skills, learned how to conduct an interview, and also learned about the importance of working together. Without proper teamwork, collaboration, or communication, not much is possible. These two weeks also led me to think about my future, and what field I would like to work in. I am very pleased with how my internship went and am much more involved in the GGU community!"





THE GGU MENTORING PROGRAM

The GGU Mentoring Program offers teen girls regular one-on-one mentoring over 12 months, from women who are leaders in their community or business area. The program focuses specifically on leadership skills like building confidence, public speaking, self awareness, leadership, and entrepreneurship.

The 2023 mentoring program included 23 GGU alumni in six countries representing three Girls Gearing Up Academy cohorts. In an effort to support as many motivated girls as possible, we included girls who had not previously been part of GGU programming but who were inspired to grow and learn in our international community. We are so thankful to the mentors who donate their time to inspire our young leaders, and to Tia Robinson (Expath, Berlin), who is our volunteer mentoring program coordinator.

Every month, we provide the mentoring pairs access to a short educational video on topics ranging from public speaking to budgeting and negotiation. Our resource library continues to grow with valuable content thanks to generous contributions from people in our network.

A CELEBRATION OF LEARNING

To celebrate the learning and growth that occured during the 2023 mentoring program, we wrapped up our third mentoring cohort with an online celebration that brought together mentees and mentors. In addition to reflecting on key takeaways and lessons learned, we heard from dynamic speakers Eirini Rapti and Lenora Chu, who insightfully answered participant questions about choosing career paths, facing struggles along the way, and the role mentoring has played in their own lives.

THE GGU YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD

Since 2021, the GGU Youth Advisory Board has been helping steer the direction of the organization while also implementing their own events.

Leandra, 2023 Youth Advisory Board Chair:

"In the third year of the Youth Advisory Board to GGU, our aim was to consolidate ourselves among the community and create **engaging content and events for the alumni.** The YAB launched its **Podcast**, Experts in Experiences, which is a platform for alumni to discuss their experiences, lessons learned and more with the community. Additionally, we hosted **several events with aim to connect the alumni network**, ranging from more low-key discussions, to workshops. To stay in touch with alumni, we created an **announcements chat** used by the whole GGU community to continue our support of girls beyond just the camp.

Despite the events and initiatives being important, most notable to me this year was the **consolidation of the YAB internally, and its work in connecting the alumni.** The YAB had its first year with assigned positions, allowing for more structure and system in planning events and achieving goals.

We have consolidated organisational logistics, held regular and productive meetings, and created a solid structure for future YABs to continue on with.

As a last task, the YAB has successfully recruited the next board of 2024 to continue the project we started and of course create new ones."

CHANGEMAKER SPOTLIGHT APOLLINE • 17 • FRANCE

Apolline joined our 2023 Leadership Academy in Berlin through our collaboration with Becomtech, a French non-profit organization focused on promoting the role of women in tech. In her Academy application, Apolline said she wanted to join GGU because **"I want to fight against discrimination in general, like racism, and sexism. Women deserve to have the same chances as men, because we have the same abilities and projects ... I think it is an incredible opportunity for women, no matter their ethnicity or wealth, to pave their way into an man's world with the help of incredible Mentors.**"

Throughout the Academy week, Apolline contributed her insights, ideas, and hopes with the community while always encouraging and supporting others. On the last full day of the Academy, when all participants shared their commitments to promoting stability, Apolline presented the idea she had begun developing: an **application Ec(h)o that helps people turn eco anxienty into eco action.**

Apolline continued to develop this innovative idea after her return home, and **was recently named in the 2024 laureate for the prestigious Les Margaret Junior, a prize which** recognizes women whose innovations respond to the major challenges facing our society. As the 2024 winner, Apolline will receive support from JFD, an international accelerator, so that she can fully develop her app. When finished, users of her app will find both resources for managing their anxiety (with breathing or meditation exercises, for example) and actions to get involved locally, in their daily lives.

Apolline has also joined our 2024 mentoring cohort, where we have paired her with a dynamic entrepreneur in tech, and she has taken on the role of Events Coordinator on our Youth dvisory board. Apolline is not only very active at our online events, but also spreads the word about the events her community in France, so that we can reach even more girls with our programming.

Apolline embodies so many admirable changemaker qualities- she is taking action herself while empowering others to do so as well; She is taking every opportunity to grow while lifting others up on her way.

We are excited to see what's next for Apolline!



GGU ANNUAL REPORT 2023

GIRLS GEARING UP IS FUELED BY PASSION

Since 2015, we have steadily increased the number of girls we can include in our everexpanding, powerful network of changemakers. **2023 was our biggest year yet** in terms of girls reached (>150), new facilitators trained, and power mentors who spoke with our girls (>30). We have also worked to expand our network by collaborating with a number of fantastic organizations and schools that share our values of supporting and equipping the next generation of female leaders.



2023 Revenue & Support

Limited Resources, Big Impact Even as we have continued to expand our reach and programs, our team remains small, and our resources very limited. Our year-round global coordination and support as well as all program organization and administration is managed by our one employee and volunteer director. We are so grateful for volunteer mentoring program coordinator Tia Robinson, operations volunteer Lena Sönnichsen, our volunteer mentors, and our freelance facilitators who join us for the Leadership Academies. We are still striving toward creating a more sustainable financial basis to ensure the continuation of our work.
